

Hunger for Love




Whatever the reason is, there are people who have closed their minds to the reality regarding sexual love and playing in their fantasy worlds.

^{*}The misunderstanding of love "love is something to be ordered" and a certain belief like "a woman must follow a man" may also raise the sense of reality of the imagination.




Cannibalism

By the way, this imagination is called cannibalism. What a great imaginative power the human beings have!




Lust Murder
